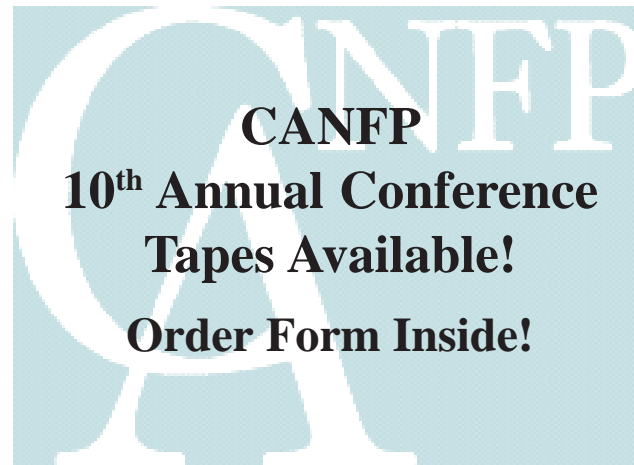

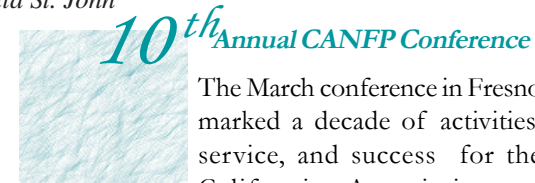

The March conference in Fresno marked a decade of activities, service, and success for the California Association of Natural Family Planning, and there was a tone of celebration throughout the day! Held at the new Exhibit Hall of the Fresno Convention Center, the event was attended by 125 people from around the state who gathered to **Share the Treasure**. One first time attendee summed up the experience this way: "It was my first conference with CANFP and I do think the whole conference was excellent and I do realize the superb amount of hard work that went into the planning of this colossal event. You are to be commended for making it a truly great, warm, friendly, educational event and with everlasting results." Another put it more succinctly "I love this conference!"

Mary Davenport, MD, began the day with an eye opening explanation of In Vitro Fertilization, exposing the many ethical concerns associated with this common procedure, and presenting the benefits of NFP and cooperative medical therapies in the treatment of infertility. The question and answer session could have gone on much longer than the allotted time, because many of us know the heartbreak of infertility

within our own families, medical practices, and NFP clientele.

Perhaps it was Dr. Davenport's presentation which inspired these remarks from a participant: "It was great! When I arrived I was worried I didn't belong because of our struggle with infertility but we got so much information. We met great people who shared openly with us and offered to keep us in their prayers. What a wonderful day!"

Of course any couple experiencing infertility will be informed of the availability of IVF--how many will be aware of the benefits of NFP? The treasure must be shared, and Pat Homan of Couple to Couple League gave us some good insights into how to do that

more skillfully in his presentation on marketing NFP. He focused on effective visual presentations, and his examples clearly showed a good message can get lost in a poor presentation. Pat also emphasized collaborating, not competing, with other NFP providers in making NFP services available.

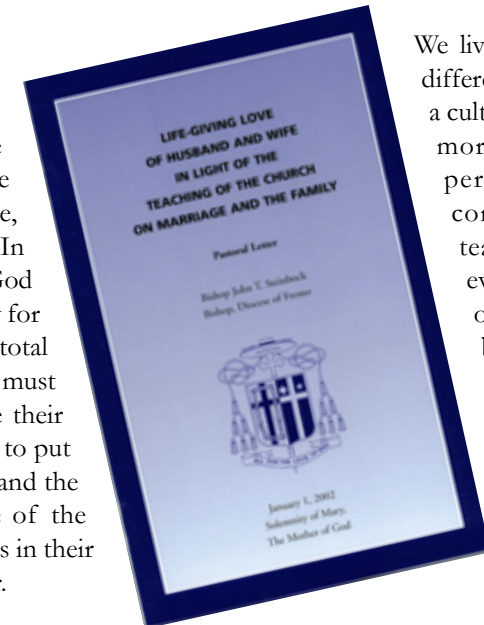

Excerpt from Bishop John T. Steinbock's Pastoral Letter

Proclaim it loud and clear

The love of husband and wife, in the Sacrament of Marriage, speaks to us of God's great love. True marriage requires the reciprocal gift of exclusive, unending and fruitful love. In the Sacrament of Marriage God pledges the graces necessary for a couple to persevere in this total self-giving love. But a couple must have the humility to realize their need for the Lord, the faith to put the Lord first in their lives, and the will to follow the example of the total self-giving love of Jesus in their relationship with each other.

Fr. Marc Calegari, S.J.

Each year since its inception, CANFP has given its M. A. Calegari, S.J. Award to an outstanding member of the NFP community. Why did we choose to name our annual award after Fr. Calegari? Perhaps you will let me explain.

He I first met Fr. Marc Calegari through my sister, in my home parish of St. Clare, in Santa Clara. A newly ordained Jesuit, he was summer “supply” in 1962, for vacationing priests. Soon after, he left for Rome where he was a “distinguished” simultaneous translator in French for Vatican II. He also served in that capacity for the 32nd and 33rd General Congregation of the Society of Jesus. All I knew at that point was that this new priest in our parish spoke French and here was an opportunity to polish my skills.

Armed with some of my favorite French books and whispering a few prayers, I walked that morning to St. Clare’s Rectory, totally unprepared for what would become a life-changing experience: my introduction to

Natural Family Planning.

Although the pill had been introduced just a few years before, Fr. Calegari was convinced that its effect, both morally and physically, would be disastrous for marriage and especially for women. The French books he loaned me that day and the articles in French he gave me to read, educated me in an understanding I had never before explored. As a recent Catholic College graduate, the little we had learned about birth control in our theology and philosophy classes contained neither the depth or the breadth of church teaching these materials presented. I was hooked and these few meetings laid the foundation for a life-long friendship, lasting until his death in 1992 at the age of 62. And our friendship was not unique. His association with couples in the US, Canada, France, Italy, and England was legendary. Just here in California, he would drop in on or call the Hernings, Sheila and Les St. John, Dr. Suzanne and Tom Regul, the Lockettis, Evelyn Eaton, Margarita Mendoza, the Hamlons, Judy and Eric Wilmurt, Gloria Gillogley, Susie McConneloug. No doubt he touched the lives of many more whose names I do not recall. Wherever he went, whomever he met, he would open his capacious briefcase and bring out article after article, drawing ever more distinctly the connections between divorce and contraception, between contraception and abortion, between good marriages and

great marriages.

Fr. Calegari became a storied NFP promoter, amassing a huge library of books, articles and tapes, some of which is housed in the library at Pope Paul VI Institute. His fame spread and soon he was a sought-after speaker whenever there was a national or international NFP Conference. Although he never wrote a book of his own (he taught for 24 years at Brophy College Prep in Phoenix and said he never had time to write) he worked for years on a translation of *Humanae Vitae* from the original Italian (his fourth language). He gave it a nuanced, more accessible approach that makes the document eminently more readable than the stilted versions translated from the Latin.

In all of his teaching, he was careful not to promote one method over another. Yet, even back in 1962, I saw clearly that temperature could only show post-ovulatory infertility and

fidelidad conyugal. En el párrafo 2366 nos habla de La fecundidad del matrimonio. Es por eso que ahora puedo comprender que no son lo mismo, aunque los dos pospongan el embarazo. El "estilo de vida de la PNF" es estar abiertos a la vida en cada acto matrimonial renovando nuestra promesa de fidelidad en una entrega mutua y total. En la Convención pudimos escuchar el testimonio de vida de Socorro y Ramiro Hernandez. Llamado "Una Cuarta



Oportunidad de ser Padres" dijeron que la Iglesia tiene razón en enseñar sobre el control natal. Socorro nos dijo que por los primeros 4 años de su matrimonio no llegaron los hijos y ahora tienen tres. Ella nos dijo que cuando estaba embarazada del tercer hijo, el medico les recomendó insistentemente la esterilización para alguno de los dos, no les recomendaba otros métodos anticonceptivos, ni siquiera les menciono algún método natural, pues seria la tercer cesaría. Sin embargo ellos aprendieron la PNF con el método Sintotérmico que enseña La Liga de Pareja a Pareja. Dijeron que este método natural los salvo de la esterilización. that just using temperature would make for a lot of abstinence. Letters back and forth to Rome did not answer my questions satisfactorily as he explained a complicated mathematical formula for determining the pre-ovulatory infertile phase. He constantly called my attention to what the French called "La Glaire" (mucus) but neither he nor I made the connection that the Billings were to introduce to America in 1972.

When I learned the Ovulation Method and began to teach it, we had many a long discussion as to which method was better. I could never convert him to "mucus-only" because, I think, he thought the multi-sign approach brought both the couple into the experience: the husband recording the temperature each day and the wife recording the mucus, "mittleshmerz", and the cervical opening or closing. Nonetheless, he would never say one method was better than the other and always taught me to understand that people have different needs.

Over the years, Fr. Calegari inspired me to write, to teach, to promote NFP, even to found CANFP as an organization designed to promote all methods. When I would get discouraged at the many obstacles to promoting NFP, he would always be there with an encouraging word and a joke (usually a very bad pun).

Years later, as Family Life Director for the Diocese of San Jose, I read Pope John Paul II's words in Familiaris Consortio and I thought right away of Fr. Calegari. "The choice of the natural rhythms," the Pope says, "involves accepting the cycle of the person, that is the woman, and thereby accepting dialogue, reciprocal respect, shared responsibility, and self-control." (#32) That evening I called Fr. Calegari and asked if he had given the Pope some articles to read or perhaps sent him a tape, "although," I told him, "you say it somewhat better!" He laughed and told me how fortunate we were to be blessed with this Pope, "He really understands!" and immediately referred me to

JPII's Wednesday Audiences from 1979 to 1984 on what is now called the Theology of the Body.

Fr. Calegari also understood the importance of teaching women to love and cherish their fertility because he knew that, ultimately, through women who know, love and understand their own fertility, marriages could be saved, marriages could be made stronger and abortion could be ended. Above all, in every set back and every disappointment, he never gave up teaching, promoting and challenging his students, his audiences and his friends to be better learners, better parents, better married couples, "all for the greater glory of God."

His obituary in "The Jesuit" says it best, I think: "He was aware of the controversy this mission [NFP] would engender, but he spoke and acted the prophet and left himself open to the consequences."

Amen.

Bishop John T. Steinbock 2003 Calegari Award Recipient

Steinbock, Bishop of the Diocese of Fresno, was named the 2003 recipient of the **Calegari Award** at the 10th Annual Conference of the **California Association of Natural Family Planning** held at the Fresno Convention Center on March 22, 2003. The 125 members of the California Association of Natural Family Planning in attendance at the banquet enthusiastically applauded a surprised Bishop Steinbock as he humbly accepted the award from Dr. Gregory Polito, Immediate Past President of CANFP. Dr. Polito presented Bishop Steinbock with a beautiful Lladro art piece depicting a husband and wife surrounded by their children, provided by an anonymous donor, which the Bishop said will serve as “a reminder of the beauty and wonder of the Christian family that lives in accordance with God’s will and love.”

Bishop Steinbock was recognized for a lifetime of courageous and faithful leadership, and specifically for two significant contributions he has made this past year:

- 1) A Pastoral Letter *Life Giving Love of Husband and Wife in Light of the Teaching of the Church on Marriage and the Family*;
- 2) A Convocation for 130 Clergy of the Diocese of Fresno *God’s Design for Married Love*.

In his pastoral letter, Bishop Steinbock recognizes “The church must be at the forefront not only of proclaiming the dignity and permanence of marriage, but also of speaking about and explaining Natural Family Planning” and the Bishop has added greatly to our understanding of the importance and urgency of this in his thirteen page pastoral. He recognizes the obstacles, and the crucial role of clergy in overcoming them, stating in his pastoral “it is the responsibility

of the priest in each parish to take a leadership role in teaching the people entrusted to his care this teaching of the Church, which can enable couples to be faithful till death.” Recognizing the clergy are on the front lines of this issue, Bishop Steinbock engaged the services of CANFP to provide them with 4 days of education on *God’s Design for Married Love* because “priests are also the ones who have to encourage with pastoral care and love couples as they struggle to live by the teaching of the Church regarding true conjugal love in the midst of a society that scorns any vision of sexuality apart from an unrestrained and autonomous understanding.” Bishop Steinbock showed great insight into the dynamic of the role of NFP in marriage, explaining “Natural Family Planning is not simply an effective and medically healthy means for the spacing of children. It is a way of life that enables husband and wife to base their relationship on the truth of God’s life-giving love.”

Board Honors Dr. Gregory Polito for Service

Gregory Polito, MD, KM, was honored at the business meeting of the 10th Annual Conference for his dedicated service as the third President of the California Association of Natural Family Planning. Board members expressed their gratitude that, even though he will be stepping down from the duties of President, he has generously agreed to remain on the Executive Board. In presenting the award, Executive Director Sheila St. John praised Dr. Polito for his vision and leadership. Dr. Polito greatly influenced the direction of CANFP, inspiring ambitious goals in the development of a Business Plan

and sharing insights in his quarterly President’s Perspective.



Under Dr. Polito’s guidance, CANFP developed a clergy education program and implemented it in collaboration with the Diocese of Fresno. Dr. Polito never wavered in keeping

a steady hand on the course charted for CANFP. Professionally, Dr. Polito has demonstrated this same faithful leadership as a practicing physician in urology, specializing in vasectomy reversal. To serve as an enduring reminder of the Board’s appreciation of his spiritually grounded leadership, and friendship, Dr. Polito was presented with a framed picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe, lovingly donated by the Carmelite Sisters, and affixed with a plaque acknowledging his significant contribution during his tenure as President of CANFP from 2001 to 2002.
